<u>ArtsReady San Diego</u> is a FREE two-hour workshop for San Diego regional artists that will provide some best practices specifically for protecting artists' studios and artworks from unexpected emergencies such as wildfires and supply FREE inventory tools to organize their studios, track their artworks, materials, and mailing lists, and much more.

ArtsReady San Diego will be offered on Saturday, February 19, 2011. Artists can choose from a morning session from 11 am to 1 pm and an afternoon session from 2 pm to 4 pm. A free lunch will be provided for both sessions from 1 pm to 2 pm. ArtsReady SD will be held at Space 4 Art at 325 15th Street, Downtown San Diego, CA 92101.

ArtsReady San Diego is connected to a national movement that seeks to increase the capacity of the arts and culture sector to survive unanticipated events related to disasters through adequate planning. Led by public and private arts funders, arts service providers, individual artists, and nonprofit arts and culture organizations, the goal is for readiness planning to become a <u>business standard</u>, where records and portfolios are backed up remotely, studios and arts facilities are prepared for emergencies, crisis communications plans and contact lists are accurate and up to date, and plans for restarting critical business functions as quickly and completely as possible are in place.

To contribute to this effort locally, the ArtsReady SD workshop will include:

- Presentation on the <u>Studio Protector</u>, an easy-to-use and engaging wall guide reference tool developed by CERF+ that contains essential checklists and tips for emergency preparation and response
- Instructions for Art Tracker, an art management software program that documents and tracks artworks and manages mailing lists
- Presentation on business insurance by an agent who specializes in artist's needs
- Testimonials from local artists who will share their personal experiences with the California wildfires
- Networking opportunity during lunch with other artists in attendance
- Worksheets for artists to develop and implement their own individualized emergency and disaster preparedness plans

ArtsReady SD will also supply artists with several FREE tools:

- <u>Studio Protector</u>, an easy-to-use and engaging reference wall guide reference tool developed by CERF+ that contains essential checklists and tips for emergency preparation and response
- Art Tracker, an art management software program that documents and tracks artworks and manages mailing lists
- United Policyholders' Roadmap to Preparedness Home and Studio tool that allows an inventory of studio equipment and art materials on a portable flash drive
- Information on arranging art studios for maximum safety and security

ArtsReady San Diego is coordinated by Synergy Art Foundation, sponsored by San Diego Visual Arts Network, and funded through a grant from the San Diego Regional Disaster Fund, a supporting organization of The San Diego Foundation. Information on emergency preparedness is supplied by CERF+ (Craft Emergency Relief Fund). We would like to acknowledge the Arts and Culture Program of The San Diego Foundation for the additional grant which supported the purchase of the Studio Protectors from CERF+ which will be given to the artists participating in this workshop and program.

Synergy Art Foundation was established in November 2003 in response to the untold damage created by the San Diego fires.
