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ATHENAEUM EXHIBITION TO SHOWCASE WORKS OF SAN DIEGO ART PRIZE WINNERS:

Einar and Jamex de la Torre with emerging artist Julio Orozco

La Jolla, CA (March 9, 2011)—The Athenaeum Music & Arts Library is pleased to announce an exhibition by 2010 San Diego Art Prize recipients Einar and Jamex de la Torre, April 2 through May 7, in the Main Gallery. An opening reception will be held on Friday, April 1, 6:30–8:30 p.m. Presented by the San Diego Visual Arts Network, the San Diego Art Prize is awarded to several established and emerging San Diego artists whose achievements in the field of visual arts merit recognition. Each season, winning artists receive exhibition opportunities, a cash prize, and are asked to select an emerging artist to share the spotlight.

The de la Torre brothers are Mexican-born artists and collaborators whose work on both sides of the San Diego-Baja California border has garnered much attention. Originally from Guadalajara, Jalisco, the brothers moved to the United States to study at California State University Long Beach in the 1980s. They have been commissioned for several site-specific and public projects, but are most widely known for their brilliantly colored glass and mixed-media works which juxtapose familiar cultural icons with found objects, all with a dose of social commentary and humor. "We're not into content-devoid art or minimalism. The whole idea of having to write about something to explain it suggests that perhaps you should be a writer. Visual art should be visual. If you don't entice me to look, who cares?" says Einar about the brothers' hybrid and sometimes controversial visual style. Einar and Jamex de la Torre have worked, taught, and exhibited both nationally and internationally.

Julio Orozco has been selected by the de la Torre brothers as the emerging artist for their San Diego Art Prize exhibition. Orozco's beginnings as a documentary crime photographer for a daily newspaper inform his experimental works, which include installation, video, and photography.
