Fusing Energy for San Diego Visual Arts: Mentorship, Education, Recognition, Collaboratio n

OVERVIEW: The **ART PRIZE** is a cash sum awarded annually for excellence in the field of Visual Arts in the San Diego region. It is intended to heighten public awareness of artwork being created in the county and to elevate all levels of the Visual Arts locally. The prize money is used by the selected artists towards the continued pursuit of excellence in their chosen field. A nominating committee of respected SD art professionals nominates a short list of regional established and emerging artists who are given not only a cash prize but also an exhibition of their work.

PRECEDENT: The most prestigious models for the San Diego ART PRIZE are the highly successful Turner Prize (http://www.tate.org.uk/britain/turnerprize), sponsored by the Tate Gallery in London, England, and the Beck's Futures (http://www.becksfutures.co.uk), also in Britain. GOALS as presented by the San Diego Visual Arts Network, is to:

- Recognize and celebrate existing visual art accomplishments by spotlighting local artists.
- Create an exciting event that facilitates cross-pollination between cultural organizations and strengthens and invigorates the San Diego Visual Art Scene.
- Broaden the audience of the visual arts in San Diego by gaining international attention to the competition through a dedicated media campaign.
- Promote the vision of the future role that the visual arts will play in the San Diego community as lively, thriving, positive and empowering.
- Expand the infrastructure of spokespeople/art celebrities who can bring awareness to San Diego and perform as role models for our student artists.

SD ART PRIZE FAQ

What is the Prize for? The SD Art Prize annually awards art of excellence made in San Diego County by





three established artists and three emerging artists. There is no age, gender or ethnic requirements attached to the prize. Art can be of any media but consideration is given to the restrictions of the exhibitions spaces for work on display.

What is the purpose of the Prize? The SD Art Prize give exposure to six deserving SD County artists per year through a series of exhibitions, websites, published reviews, catalogues and educational materials. It also grows a network of art professionals and an advisory board of patrons and facilitates collaboration with arts organizations and media to raise awareness of the visual arts.

Who gives the money? The money is raised by the San Diego Visual Arts Network, which is a non-profit organization whose mission is to promote the arts and art education mainly but not exclusively within the County of San Diego. SDVAN believes art, in its diverse forms, enriches our lives, can be a catalyst for personal development, empowerment, enhanced creativity, community building and positive social changes. In 2006/2007 the prize money came from The Smart Family Foundation. Each established artists receives \$2500 and each emerging artists receives \$1000.

Why is it held where it is held? The L-Street Gallery of the Omni Hotel sponsors four of the exhibitions by generously donating space and the supporting expenses of the exhibitions. The 2006/2007 SD Art Prize artists will also been shown at the California Center for the Arts, Escondido in March 1 – May 31of 2008. A special exhibition of all nominated emerging artists for the 2007/2008 SD Art Prize will be held at Simayspace at Art College International in June of 2007.

Why is the prize given? The prize is given in recognition of work these artists have created in the three years previous to the award year. It is not a lifetime achievement award but the aim is to recognize as many artist of excellence as possible during the lifetime of the prize.

Who picks the artists? The established artists are chosen by a nominating committee that changes yearly and by the SD Art Prize executive committee. The establish artists then choose the emerging artists to mentor and with for co-exhibitions. All work nominated are considered worthy of the award. Artists are chosen for each year to maintain a balance of age, gender, medium and ethnicity.

Who picks the work for the show? The artists choose the work for the show in cooperation with the curator of the space.

What do the selectors look for? The nominating committee looks for a body of work of excellence created in the last three years, which explores a unique viewpoint.

Who produces the SD Art Prize? The SD ART PRIZE is produced by The Art Girls: Joan Seifried, Ann Berchtold and Patricia Frischer





Is the public involved in the choice? The public can make suggestions of artist whom they think are worthy of the prize. Suggestions are passed on to the nominators. **SD Art Prize Survey**
