


Dear Friend,

LISANE BASQUIAT

Business & Entrepreneurship

Lisane Basquiat is a multi-faceted entrepreneur and advocate for personal empowerment. She is the Founder and Chief Executive Officer of Shaping Freedom, a personal growth company that trains individuals to gain empowerment through internal congruence and spiritual alignment. Basquiat owns Hera Hub Carlsbad, a female-focused, inclusive coworking space, entrepreneurial community, and business accelerator. She also serves as the coadministrator of the Jean-Michel Basquiat Estate, honoring her brother's legacy and making his art accessible to the world.



OCEAN BEACH WOMAN'S CLUB

The Ocean Beach Woman's Club was established in 1924 and is one of the oldest civic and philanthropic groups in San Diego. Their purpose is to give members a place to create social connections, support their neighborhood, and empower others to be changemakers and leaders. Their work has been monumental in facilitating the installation of sewers and streets throughout Ocean Beach and securing lifeguards for their beaches. Ocean Beach Woman's Club is celebrating 100 years of service this year.



ANDREA SCHLAGETER <u>Civic Engagement</u>

Andrea Schlageter is the Chair of the Ocean Beach Planning Board, Secretary of the Point Loma Association, and the leader of the Community Planners Committee (CPC), a group that represents San Diego's forty-eight neighborhood planning groups at City Hall. She is the youngest person ever to lead the CPC.

Gaby B. Love is a first-generation Mexican-American and daughter of migrant farmworkers. She is a long-time resident of North County and is the Outreach Specialist in School Relations & Diversity at MiraCosta College. After hours, Love devotes her time to her community, frequently volunteering with various organizations and advocating for her students.



DR. DANIELLE HAULSEE STEM

Dr. Danielle Haulsee is the Chief Science Officer at Hubbs-Seaworld Research Institute (HSWRI). specializing in fisheries, oceanography, and marine mammal ecology. She received her Ph.D. in 2017 from the University of Delaware's College of Earth, Ocean, and Environment. Currently, she oversees the science program at HSWRI. She is a member of the American Fisheries Society and The Oceanography Society and a contributing member of the Diversifying and Integrating Marine Education at Stations (DIMES) and Ecosystem Services Observation Network. She mentors and promotes STEM education to underrepresented groups in her spare time through organizations like the Society for Women in Marine Science, the Gill's Club, the Skypea-Scientist program, and the University of Delaware's Mentor Collective Program.

Dana Bristol-Smith is the Founder of the Leap to Success Women's Leadership program, a project aimed at empowering domestic violence survivors. She has made it her mission to expand the program for women across the country who are overcoming adversity.
